Application for permit to carry on an activity for business (commercial filming) in marine parks Application Guideline

Nobody shall carry on business activity in marine parks without first obtaining a permit from the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD).

All applications should be sent to AFCD at least 8 working days before the intended date of filming. Each application may cover only one marine park.

At the time of application, the exact location intended for filming and the detailed filming description or scripts of the relevant scenes should be provided with relevant maps (maps of countryside or other maps of a minimum scale of 1:20,000) attached for reference.

Upon collection of the permit, a non-refundable permit fee at the rate of HK\$180 shall be payable.

Requests for correction or alteration of any information in the permit will be treated as a fresh application, which once approved, attracts fees at the normal rates of permit fees.

All vessels brought into or used in the marine park should have an appropriate licence issued by the Marine Department. Mooring or anchoring outside designated anchoring areas is prohibited. In this connection, a separate application has to be made to AFCD.

Each filming period under application should not extend over 2 days. Approval will <u>NOT</u> be granted for any Sunday or public holiday.

In principle, areas that will not be approved for carrying activity are marine reserves, marine park areas prone to ecological impacts and marine park management centres.

Besides, unless with express approval, activity of the following scenes is strictly prohibited: lighting of fire or use of fireworks or explosives or any pyrotechnic materials; vessels navigating at a speed of over 10 knots per hour; any act of fishing or fishing with spear guns; and other acts prohibited or controlled under the Marine Parks and Marine Reserves Regulations.
